Surveillance Report – COVID-19

Highlights

- No new confirmed cases since 11APR, but the number of general surveillance samples continues to decrease.
- H2S2 testing in 5 buildings in Phnom Penh is complete. 810 residents and staff were tested and all were negative.
- Trial of self-swabbing by patients at AKS begun on 24APR, but all patients tested negative for the second time and were discharged.
- The Surveillance Team met with IFRC and GDP leadership on 24APR to plan enhanced surveillance among 38,000 detainees and prison employees, social mobilization, case management, and coordination with COVID-19 response teams.

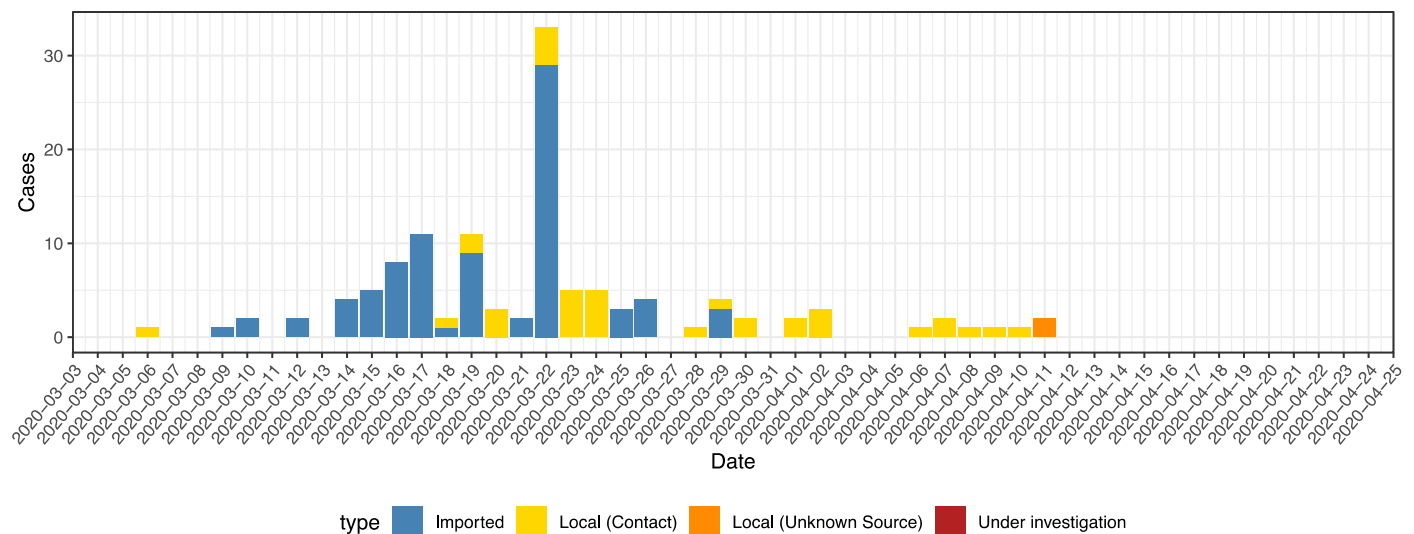

Confirmed Cases*

To date (25/04/2020), there have been 122 confirmed cases and 1 probable cases of COVID-19; 85 linked to overseas travel, 36 locally acquired linked to cases confirmed in Cambodia or abroad, and 2 locally acquired of unknown source.

Figure 1: Confirmed and probable cases of COVID-19 by acquisition status and date of positive test, beginning 03 March 2020



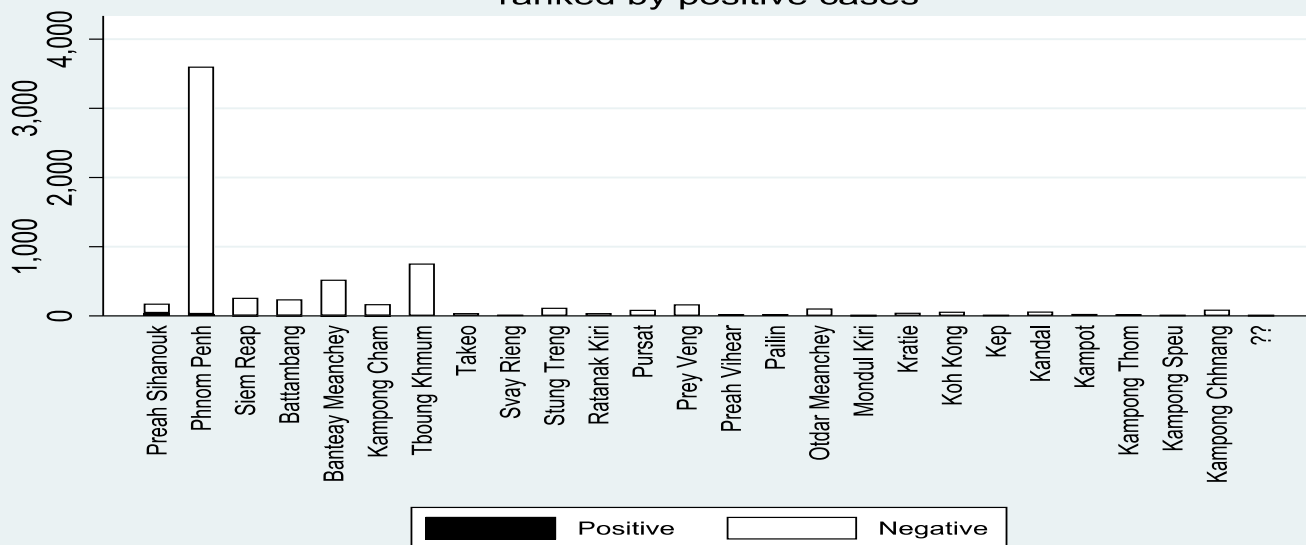

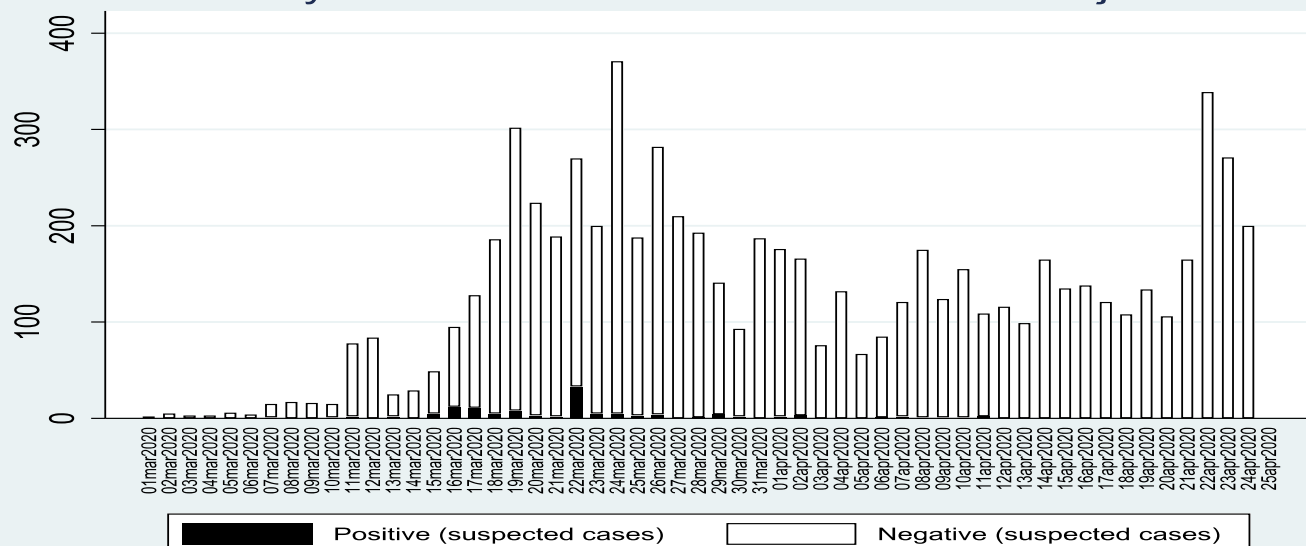

Numbers of subjects tested by Province ranked by positive cases

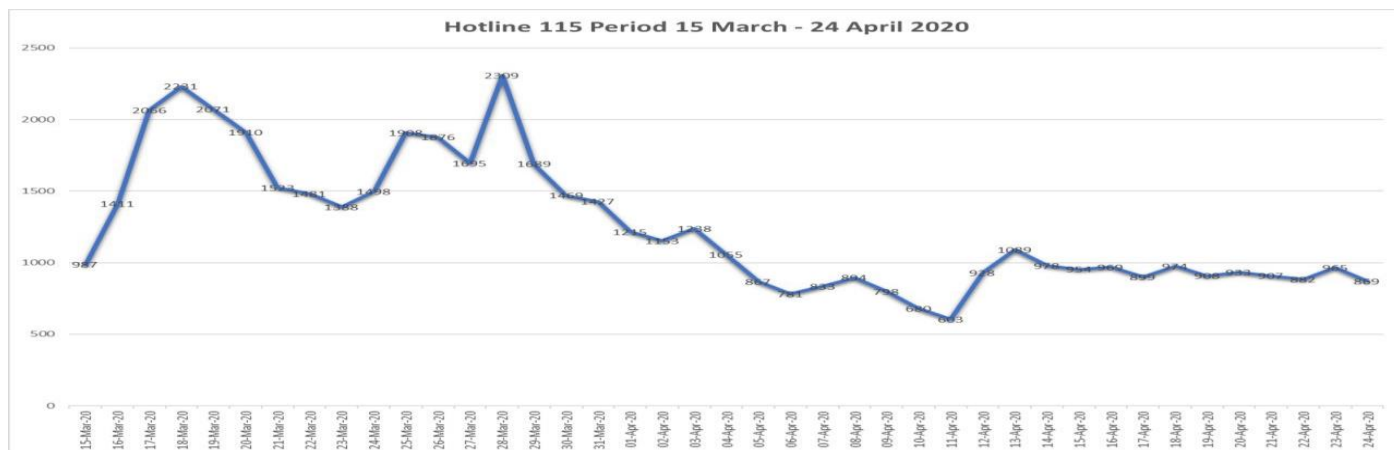


Daily Results of Tested Surveillance Subjects

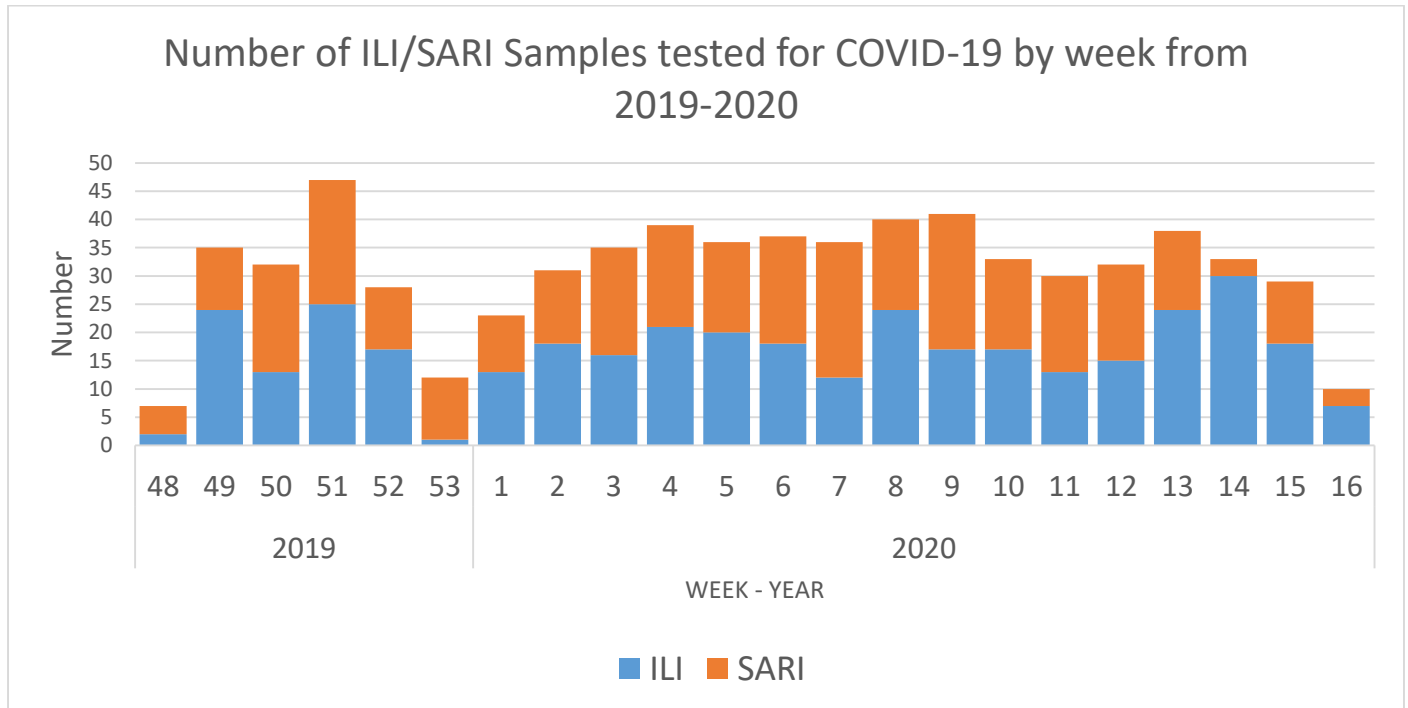
Trend in all calls to 115 hotline since 15 March.
